CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

(i) St. James's Palace.

Instructions for wearing Badges round the neck by the possessors of the Insignia of more than one Order which is so worn.

Only one Ribbon and Badge, i.e., the senior one, is worn round the neck inside and under the Collar of the Uniform Coat, so that the Badge hangs about an inch outside and below the front of the Collar.

G.O. 12 1920 INSTRUCTIONS RELATIVE TO THE WEARING OF THE INSIGNIA OF ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD AND DECORATIONS.

CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

St. James's Palace.

(i)

Instructions for wearing Badges round the neck by the possessors of the Insignia of more than one Order which is so worn.

Only one Ribbon and Badge, i.e., the senior one, is worn round the neck inside and under the Collar of the Uniform Coat, so that the Badge hangs about an inch outside and below the front of the Collar.

Members of the Order of Merit	} Should wear the ribbon to which the Badge is suspended under the tie, which should be a bow, the badge hanging about three-quarters of an inch below the bow.

The method of wearing the ribbons of Orders, Decorations and Medals, which will be the same in all cases, both for men and women, is as follows:—

A piece of the ribbon one and a half inches wide, or the width of the medal ribbon, and half an inch in depth, mounted on a bar of metal in the form of a brooch, to be worn on the left breast of the coat, or in a corresponding place on the dress as the case may be.

NOTE.—The above intimation only refers to Morning Dress and does not alter the regulations with regard to wearing Orders, Decorations and Medals with uniform, or with Evening Dress.
