G. O. 105 KING'S REGULATIONS AND ORDERS  
1938 FOR THE ROYAL CANADIAN AIR  
FORCE, 1924, PERMANENT AND NON-  
PERMANENT—AMENDMENTS (No. 2)

King's Regulations and Orders for the Royal Canadian Air Force, 1924, Permanent and Non-Permanent, are amended as follows:—

*Insert* new paragraph 216H as follows:—

G. O. 105 "216H (1) Chaplains appointed to the  
1938 Royal Canadian Air Force (Non-Permanent) may be granted honorary rank on appointment and be recommended for promotion in accordance with the following:—

- (a) On appointment. . . . Honorary Flight Lieutenant  
(b) After completing 10 years' commissioned service. . . Honorary Squadron Leader

(2) Promotion to the rank of Honorary Wing Commander may be conferred upon an officer holding an appointment as described above for distinguished service in the field, or for meritorious or distinguished service other than in the field, or on retirement with not less than fifteen years' commissioned service and a total of twenty-five years' service.

(Effective 1st January, 1938.)

G. O. 105 "286C. Promotion to the rank of corporal,  
1938 sergeant, flight sergeant and warrant officer class II, will, for a period of six months, be provisional (paid). Confirmation of rank will be made by the Director of the Royal Canadian Air Force and will be antedated to the date of the provisional appointment. Recom-

mentation for confirmation of provisional rank held by a n.c.o., or warrant officer will be made to National Defence Headquarters by the airman's Commanding Officer on completion of the provisional period provided the airman is qualified and has satisfactorily performed the duties for the higher rank. The Director of the Royal Canadian Air Force shall have authority to revert to substantive rank during the provisional period, any airman who fails to pass examinations prescribed or to perform efficiently and satisfactorily the duties for the higher rank provisionally held."




