(1) An officer or soldier of The Canadian Army, other than one who is a member of the Permanent Active Militia, who has been granted leave of absence without pay and allowances, shall not be eligible to receive at the public expense medical, hospital or dental treatment in respect of any disease or illness suffered or incurred during such leave of absence; provided, however, that this shall not extend to any medical or dental treatment or hospitalization required by any such

officer or soldier as a result of any injury, disease or illness suffered or incurred while serving on Active Service with pay and allowances in the Naval, Military or Air Forces of Canada, if such officer or soldier is otherwise eligible therefor.



16. Where no sleeping accommodation is furnished at public expense, there may be paid to each man who has reported for training on and after January 1, 1941, and has been or is to be returned to the place to which his notice to report for training was sent, a lodging allowance of one dollar and twenty-five cents for each night necessarily spent or to be spent at a stop-over point where the man has been or would ordinarily be detained for reasons beyond his control, whilst en route on his return journey to the place to which his said notice to report was sent: provided that the Commanding Officer of the training centre, camp, hospital, or place where the man was last stationed, or the Officer directly paying out the said lodging allowance to the man, is satisfied that in the ordinary course of such journey the man has travelled or will travel as he has been instructed to do, and has not taken, except for reasons beyond his control, or will not take, more than the ordinary time to cover the distance; and provided also that the decision of the Commanding Officer, or of the Officer paying out the said allowance, shall be conclusive, final, and binding, as to the amount of such lodging allowance hereunder payable to the man.
