

Please join us on Wednesday, May 1st to welcome our guest speaker, Lunch starts at 1200hrs, and the presentation will take place in the lecture room at 1330hrs.

Our featured speaker will be Jack Gin (showing his documentary about a WW1 soldier named Fred Lee). Jack was astonished to learn that a Chinese Canadian kid named Fred Lee volunteered to fight for Canada during the first World War. "As a child who grew up in Canada and educated here, we never heard these stories"; says Jack. So, the engineer and entrepreneur went in search of Fred's story, and he created an award- winning documentary in the process.



Finding Fred Lee is told through Gins eyes as he journeys to Lee's hometown of Kamloops to uncover traces of this forgotten son. Lee was an honour roll student and the son of a pioneer businessman. He signed up with the Rocky Mountain Rangers at a time when Chinese Canadians couldn't vote. Most could not hold a traditional job. He left town on the CPR— the railway that his father supplied with timbers and that thousands of Chinese men helped build. Lee survived Vimy with the 47th Battalion but was killed during the battle for Hill 70. The hill was captured but 1,877 Canadians lost their lives. His remains were never found.

The documentary takes viewers to a recently commemorated Hill 70 Memorial Park at Lens, France. A walkway emblazoned with maple leaves, named after Fred Lee, who is remembered on a panel dedicated to him. Jack Gin located Fred Lee's

nephew, and the search continues for other family members. The film has screened in Kamloops, at the Canadian War Museum, and al the Asian Film Festival in Vancouver, and it has won the best short documentary award at the International Art Festival in Berlin. Private Fred Lee is no longer forgotten,

Canadian Military to Destroy 11,000 Second World War Era Pistols

The move comes as the Canadian Forces confirmed it has received the final deliveries of a new 9-mm pistol as part of a \$19.4-million project. *David Pugliese Ottawa Citizen Apr* 24, 2024

The Canadian military plans to destroy 11,000 of its Second World War-era pistols by the end of this year. The move comes as the Canadian Forces confirmed it has received the final deliveries of a new 9-mm pistol as part of a \$19.4-million project. The military purchased the Sig Sauer P320, which is being

distributed to units. It replaces the Browning Hi-Power pistol that has been used by the Canadian Forces for decades. National Defence spokesperson Cheryl Forrest said all military units would send their Browning handguns to Canadian Forces supply depots in Quebec and Alberta for disposal. "The pistols have not yet been destroyed," she said in an email. "We anticipate the pistols will be disposed of by the end of 2024." Forrest said approximately 150 Browning Hi-Power handguns would be kept for museums, but at this point none had been distributed to those organizations. In addition, the Canadian Army is determining if a small amount of the Brownings should be kept for special purposes or specific training, she added. "The Canadian Army keeps a small stock of older small arms and small arms in service in other countries to assist with training for emergency situations and for recognition," Forrest said. "The Browning may also retain some training value as a simulation/training tool." But no final decision on that has been made, she added.

More than a million Browning Hi-Power pistols were manufactured since the Second World War and the gun has been used by dozens of militaries and police forces. The Canadian Forces previously removed another group of older weapons from its inventory when it provided modern rifles to the Canadian Rangers. That group had been using Lee Enfield rifles also from the Second World War era. Around 9,500 Lee Enfields were transferred to military cadets, mostly as nonfunctional rifles, for use in drills or training. Approximately 5,000 of the rifles were gifted to serving Canadian Rangers. Another 50 rifles were offered to museums affiliated with the Canadian Forces or military units as display artifacts, National Defence said. After that, around 1,500 Lee Enfields remained, and they were destroyed as the military ruled out sale of the surplus rifles to the general public. The Canadian Forces announced it had received the final deliveries of the new P320s on March 6. The delivery involved 16,500 of what are being called C22 pistols. Those are being used by the army, navy and air force. Another 3,200 new pistols, to be called the C24, were sent to military police units.

The federal government announced the awarding of the Sig Sauer P320 contract in October 2022. It was awarded to M.D. Charlton Co Ltd of Victoria, BC. The Sig Sauer P320 is in use with multiple militaries around the world including Denmark, France, and the United States. The Pentagon selected the P320 in 2017 and Sig Sauer is providing the US military with 420,000 of those guns. The Canadian military had been trying for years to replace its Browning Hi-Power pistols as it was running out of parts for the weapons. The acquisition project was stalled for years after small arms firms rejected in 2011 the federal government requirement that the new guns be built at Colt Canada in Kitchener, Ont. In addition, the companies balked at a stipulation that they had to turn over proprietary firearms information to Colt, a firm some saw as a competitor.

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — The UK prime minister said Tuesday the country is putting its defense industry on a "war footing" by increasing defense spending to 2.5% of GDP by the end of the decade and pledged to send arms worth 500 million pounds (\$620 million) to Ukraine. Prime Minister Rishi Sunak described the increase as the "biggest strengthening of our national defense for a generation." "In a world that is the most dangerous it has been since the end of the Cold War, we cannot be complacent," Sunak said at a news briefing alongside NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg during a visit to Poland. "As our adversaries align, we must do more to defend our country, our interests and our values." Sunak promised an extra 75 billion pounds (\$93 billion) in defense spending over the next six years. The target of 2.5% of GDP spending was a re-commitment of a target set by former Prime Minister Boris Johnson in 2022. Sunak previously said the goal would be met when economic conditions allow.

A decade ago, NATO leaders agreed to commit 2% of GDP to defense spending. Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine has given that effort new urgency. Britain has spent above that over the past decade but never higher than 2.35% in 2020, according to NATO data. "We will put the UK's own defense industry on a war footing," Sunak told British troops serving on NATO's

eastern front near Ukraine. "One of the central lessons of the war in Ukraine is that we need deeper stockpiles of munitions, and for industry to be able to replenish them more quickly." UK official figures show that defense spending last year was about 55.5 billion pounds. NATO data shows that amounting to about 2.07% of the UK's GDP, ahead of countries including France and Germany but behind Poland, the US, Estonia and others. "It's time for us to re-arm," Sunak told a news briefing alongside Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk, noting that Poland spends a larger percentage of its GDP on defense than any NATO ally. Sunak said that next year Britain would deploy its Typhoon fighter jets to Poland to help police its skies. Poland, which borders Ukraine, has seen several incursions of its airspace since Russia invaded Ukraine in 2022.

Sunak also spoke with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy to confirm the new assistance to Ukraine and "assure him of the UK's steadfast support for Ukraine's defense against Russia's brutal and expansionist ambitions," Sunak's office said. UK authorities said the commitment included 400 vehicles, 60 boats, 1,600 munitions and 4 million rounds of ammunition, at a time when Ukraine is struggling to hold off advancing Russian forces on the eastern front line. The shipment will include British Storm Shadow long-range missiles, which have a range of about 150 miles (240 kilometers) and have proved effective at hitting Russian targets. Zelenskyy has pleaded for greater international assistance, warning that his country will lose the war without it. Britain's announcement came three days after the US House of Representatives approved \$61 billion in new aid for Ukraine. The Senate was voting on the package Tuesday. Ammunition shortages over the past six months have led Ukrainian military commanders to ration shells, a disadvantage that Russia has seized on this year — taking the city of Avdiivka and currently inching towards the town of Chasiv Yar, also in the eastern Donetsk region.

Don't Come, It's A Trap

Cuban mercenary fighting in the Russian army issues chilling warning to fellow countrymen.




A Cuban mercenary has issued a warning to his fellow countrymen against fighting

for Russia in Ukraine. The unnamed man appears donning the Russian flag as he speaks in Spanish and in a Cuban accent about the situation at the front lines, claiming Cuban soldiers are not being paid what they were promised. 'This is a message for all the Cuban soldiers who are here in Ukraine,' he said. 'I've been here in the war for a while now and we are not being paid.

Many of my friends have already been killed in combat and they don't pay us what they said they would.' Russia has recruited soldiers desperate to escape the Communist island by luring them with promises of salaries of \$2,000 a month. The monthly average wage in Cuba is less than \$20. However, the Cuban soldier in Ukraine claimed: 'There are a lot of things they are doing wrong and I want to say that the salary that they are paying us is not what is supposed to be. 'Many of my friends died at the front line with no documentation, they don't want to give us documentation. 'They continue to scam us and lie to us, and we keep dying and nobody does anything.'

The soldier then spoke directly to those in his position, saying: 'For all my fellow Cubans who are in combat like me: don't let them keep lying to you. Don't take up arms. Don't lose your lives, brothers, I'm telling you. Put down the weapons. We are dying and not getting paid.' The soldier then appeared to address the risk he is likely taking by filming the video. He said: 'I would rather be sent to Moscow than lose my life and have my family receive no money.' Cuba and Russia are political allies and Cubans do not require a visa to travel to Russia. Many go there to study or to work. However, the Cuban soldier in Ukraine claimed: 'There are a lot of things they are doing wrong, and I want to say that the salary that they are paying us is not what is supposed to be. Last year, Cuban officials arrested 17 people in connection with what they described as a network to

recruit Cuban nationals to fight for Russia in Ukraine. In May 2023, a newspaper in the Russian region of Ryazan, about 100 miles southeast of Moscow, reported from a military enlistment office there that 'several citizens of the Cuba Republic' signed up to join the army. The Ryazanskiye Vedomosti newspaper quoted some Cubans as saying they were there to help Russia

'complete tasks in the special military operation zone.' It also said, 'some of them in the future would like to become Russian citizens.' In Havana, prosecutor José Luis Reyes told state TV that suspects are being investigated for crimes, including being a mercenary or recruiting mercenaries, and could face sentences of up to 30 years or life in prison, or even the death penalty. Marilin Vinent, 60, said that her son Dannys Castillo, 27, is one of the Cubans recruited in Russia. From her home in Havana last September, she said her son and other Cubans traveled at the end of July to Russia after being promised work in a construction job. 'They were all deceived,' she said. Vinent showed reporters photos of her son in her cellphone, including some of him dressed in military fatigues.

She said that her son told her he had accepted the offer to go to Russia because he wanted to economically help the family, as

the island is suffering an economic crisis, with people facing shortages of some products. 'I don't know if my son is alive. We don't know anything,' she said. 'What I would like is to talk to him.' Cuban seamstress Yamidely Cervantes told Reuters her 49-year-old husband Enrique Gonzalez, a struggling bricklayer, left their home in the small town of La Federal on July 19, 2023, to fight for the Russian army in Ukraine. Days later, he wired her part of his signing-on bonus of about 200,000 rubles (\$2,040) which she received in Cuban pesos, Cervantes told Reuters. That represents a windfall on the economically stricken communist-run island. It's more than 100 times the average monthly state salary of 4,209 pesos (\$17 in the informal market), according to the national statistics office. Cervantes' husband Gonzalez, speaking via video call from a Russian military base outside the city of Tula, south of Moscow, told Reuters he was one of 119 Cubans training there. When he arrived in Russia, he said, he had signed a contract to work for the military, translated into Spanish. 'Everyone here knew what they were coming for,' he said, smiling in military garb as he gave Reuters a digital phone tour of the camp, ringed by pine trees. 'They came for the war.' The US State Department has said it's aware of the reports. 'We are deeply concerned that young Cubans may have been deceived and recruited to fight for Russia in its brutal full-scale invasion of Ukraine, and we continue to monitor this situation closely,' it said. Russian law allows foreign nationals to enlist in its army, after signing a contract with the Defense Ministry. Since September 2022, foreigners who have served in the Russian army for at least one year are allowed to apply for Russian citizenship in a simplified procedure, without obtaining a residency permit first.

The Flame Throwing Robot Dog is Here

The company sells a variety of devices like the TF-19 WASP, a drone with a flamethrower attachment. Patty Nieberg Task & Purpose Apr 26, 2024

Prepare to update the safety brief again: a flame-throwing robot dog can now be yours for less than \$10,000. The Thermonator is the first-ever robot dog equipped with the ARC Flamethrower "to deliver on-

demand fire anywhere." The company behind the dog, Throw Flame, has made a name for itself creating commercial flame throwing devices like the TF-19 WASP, drone flamethrower attachment. The ARC Flamethrower, which is attached to the robot dog, can send 30-foot-long streams of fire up and be mounted on other devices like a tripod, rifle or utility task vehicle, or UTV. The company is marketing the robot-flamethrower combo for uses like wildfire control and prevention, snow and ice removal and of course, entertainment. For \$9,420, Throw Flame will ship the Thermonator anywhere in the U.S with a lifetime warranty.

When Throw Flame produced the WASP drone in 2020, its CEO told Task & Purpose that there had been an uptick in its backpack-style flamethrowers during the emerging threat of the so-called murder hornet. "It's hard to correlate these things, but we've seen an uptick in our traditional backpack-style flamethrowers, but we've gotten a lot of interest and recommendations on our drone flamethrower platform," Quinn Whitehead, the company's CEO told Task & Purpose. Since Throw Flame advertises its tech for agricultural management or ecological conservation, we've got one thing on our mind this year: cicadas. The loud and rather ugly insect hordes that make a terrible crunch and screaming sound when stepped on are about to infiltrate the U.S. in record numbers. Several "broods" of cicadas are expected to hatch this summer so to that we say: no thanks, bring in the flamethrowing dogs.

In 2015, the company released its X15 Flamethrower for commercial use which sparked an uproar over its legality. A New York Congressman even tried twice to pass legislation titled "H.R. 4901 — Flamethrowers? Really? Act" which would have classified flamethrowers as akin to automatic machine guns, generally outlawing their sale or use by civilians. But this is America, and you can still own a flamethrower. "Flamethrowers remain federally unregulated," according to Throw Flame's website. "This means that anyone can buy one without background checks or a

waiting period. With quick shipping, just like an Amazon package, Throwflame has delivered thousands of X15s around the globe." If you think this is the stuff of Hollywood and the big screen, you're also right. Their flamethrowers have appeared in The Purge, Quarry, Punisher, The Darkest Minds, and Burger King commercials, according to the website. A state Senator from Ohio, Niraj Antani, featured an XL18 flamethrower in his campaign ad for Ohio's 2nd Congressional district, as a challenge to Democrats that he would bring the heat. "In Congress, I'll take a flamethrower to the Biden agenda and the weak Republicans who betray us," Antani

said.

While the technology sounds like something better left to professional militaries, it's unsurprising that a flame-throwing



robot is available for public consumption. The Department of Defense is increasingly buying civilian technology for military purposes, including robot dogs and commercial drones. Flamethrowers have a long history in the military but have often been generally less effective than their fearsome reputation. In fact, the idea goes back to the Roman Empire, whose navy used a still-mysterious burning gel known as Greek Fire to attack other ships, a substance that would stick to enemy hulls and could not be extinguished with water. In the modern world, German soldiers introduced the Flammenwerfer apparaten at the Battle of Verdun in World War. British military leaders reportedly labeled the weapon "an inhuman projection of the German scientific mind" — a sinister, sadistic tool of wanton destruction. The first American man-portable flamethrower made its first "successful combat appearance" on Jan 15, 1943, at Guadalcanal, according to the Army Center of Military History but troops in the field often lacked the training or tactics to use them properly. Commanders, the Army found, often "selected untrained men and ordered them to take a flame thrower and 'burn out the Japs,' a mission which promised little chance of success." The DOD ramped up its research on man-portable and vehicle-mounted incendiary weapons following WWII, but incendiary weapons fell out of favor during the Vietnam War as horrifying imagery of their aftermath emerged, including pictures like "Napalm Girl," the 1972 Pulitzer Prize-winning photo of a naked 9-year-old girl fleeing after surviving a napalm attack. As the American public turned against incendiary weapons, the DOD issued a directive effectively retiring the weapon from the battlefield in 1978. Since then, the flamethrower has only returned for specific use cases, including during operations in the Middle East. One DOD photo from September 2008 in Iraq, shows an American soldier using a flamethrower to ignite a controlled fire on a roadside to reveal bombs concealed by brush.




