**WAR DIARIES, C.A.S.F.**

**Instructions for Compilation and Despatch**

**1. A War Diary is SECRET.**

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

**4. Post-war disposal will be as under:**

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mdn. Instr. for C.M. 1937, App. 'C'). Each entry will be initialised by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:— Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachments of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced in the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

**NOTE:** If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

Instructions regarding preparation of War Diaries, which will be kept from first day of mobilization, creation or embodiment), are contained in P.S. Regs. Vol. 2.

AMMUNITION SUPPLY.

1. The Ordnance Dept. sent up 598 cartridges which arrived on 29th June, 1940. We now have cartridges for all the live shell with 31 cartridges to spare for miss fires and bring to rounds.
2. I have to point out that with 822 rounds live shell we are 20% below minimum war establishment.
3. TUBES. We have 186 Tubes Electric, whereas we should have tubes electric for all rounds plus 10% spare, being a shortage of 752 for the ammunition in hand. As the cartridges cannot be fired without tubes, a large proportion of our ammunition is useless, until Ordnance send us tubes.
4. S.A.A. Ammunition. We are short 44,500 rounds S.A.A. Will you please instruct the District Ordnance Officer to supply the ammunition required immediately, especially, tubes electric and S.A.A., as it is obviously necessary to have sufficient ammunition in hand now that there is a probability of war in the Pacific.

AID TO NAVIGATION

1. The R.C.A.F. mooring buoy broke away during a severe gale and has disappeared. The Senior Naval Officer telegraphed this information to C.O.P.C., Esquimalt, with the request that the R.C.A.F. be notified that no moorings for aircraft are now available at York Island.
2. The buoy also served the purpose of marking the end of the rock reef which lies off the wharf. I enclose letter from the Master of the s.s. "Border Prince" that another buoy or beacon be erected, as soon as possible, as an aid to navigation.
3. The s.s. "Border Prince" is the only vessel willing to call in at York Island with supplies and water. The Union S.S. Co. absolutely refuse to call in owing to the dangerous navigation.
4. Under the circumstances I request that the D.V.O. be instructed to provide either a floating buoy or else a beacon to mark the reef.

ACCOMMODATION

Replying to your letter of 27th June, 1940.

File: V26-1-1

1. I have shown your letter to Mr. Karm, the foreman, and he informs me that he has been instructed at various times by the D.N.D.'s representatives, Lieut. Commandor, R.C.N., Lieut. A. Webster, R.C.E. and Major Macdonald, that he takes his orders from the D.N.D. or his representatives, and does not take orders from C.O. York Island or anyone else except in small details, e.g., the placing of a door, fixing a partition, etc., in a building.

2. The question arose when Col. Webb wanted additional buildings erected for vegetable room, refrigerator room, coal sheds, rebuilding the kitchen, etc., the foreman quite properly stated that he had no authority to erect those buildings and that the D.N.D. should issue instructions for them.

3. As the D.N.D. has issued no instructions whatever to him, the foreman is going ahead finishing the buildings in hand which are now nearing completion. If instructions are not received soon, the men will have to go home as no new material has been sent up by the D.N.D.

4. For your information he is waiting for instructions and material to commence the following works:

- (a) Crew shelter and parapet walls at Fort.
- (b) Water mains and tanks to supply the Fort and give essential fire protection.
- (c) Additional sleeping huts.
- (d) Gunre house.
- (e) Tractor shed, machine shop and house for fire equipment.
- (f) Flank road and sidewalks.

5. All the above have been reported on by the D.E.O.'s engineer, in some cases, months ago; all are urgent and I would request you to instruct the D.E.O. to issue orders so that these works can be carried out.







1. For your information the C.O. of the HMCS "Leola Vivian" reported to the Naval Officer i/c York Island that Tel. Barlow failed to return from trout fishing at 1600 hrs., 3rd July, 1940. The missing man was fishing in a stream which runs out of Stafford Lake into Fraser Bay at Longborough Inlet. The crew of the vessel searched for this man until night fall of that day and then proceeded to York Island where the occurrence was reported at about 0100 hrs., 4th July.

2. The E.O. i/c requested assistance from the O.C. York Island to continue the search that day, and Lieut. Learoyd, RCANU, and 12 O.R.'s experienced in the woods, embarked on the "Leola Vivian" at about 0300 hrs. and arrived early in the morning at Fraser Bay. This party searched the stream and surrounding area until 1800 hrs. without success. The party returned to York Island about 2200 hrs., and it was decided to send as large a party as possible early next morning to continue the search.

3. At 0630 hrs., 5th July, Capt. R.H. Jorgensen with two officers and 57 O.R.'s including some experienced civilian employees embarked on the HMCS "Vansle" to continue the search. This party thoroughly examined the stream and combed the wooded areas on each side for a distance of about three miles from the mouth. Dynamite charges were set off in some of the deeper pools of the stream, but no trace of the missing man was found, except a small tin in which he carried some fishing tackle. As this was found near the mouth of the stream it is believed that he was drowned. This party returned to York Island that evening at about 2200 hrs. and the result of this search was reported to the N.O. i/c.

4. On the morning of 7th July the H.C. 1/c received orders from the C.O.P.C. to continue the search, and Lieut. L.F.W. Moore and 18 O.R.'s were sent with the HMCS "Van Isle" with dragging equipment and instructed to assist in dragging operations and searching until night fall 8th July. Your wireless message No. 182 was received some time after this party had left.



RATION SHIPMENT

1. Further to our letter of 9th July, 1940, re the above wherein it was pointed out that shipment of rations should not be made on the s.s. "Chelosin" unless the s.s. "Border Prince" was too far off schedule, I have the following observations to make:

- i) 165 gallons of fresh milk was found to be sour when opened on Wednesday morning. You will realize that this shipment of milk was delivered to the Union Steamship Co.'s dock Monday afternoon and stood in the warm freight shed for several hours before being loaded on the steamer, and then spent some 30 hours in the unrefrigerated hold of the vessel. This milk was finally placed in the refrigerator at York Island at about 0130 hours Wednesday. It is therefore suggested that if shipments are to be made by the s.s. "Chelosin", evaporated milk be substituted for fresh milk.
  - ii) The steamer docked at Bayward wharf at about 0030 hours Wednesday morning. It was a very dark night and the ration party had to load the stores on our launch in complete darkness, and in doing so lost one-quarter of beef weighing about 150-lbs. overboard due to the breaking of the rope which was used to lower the stores from the wharf to the deck of the boat. As it was impossible to retrieve it that night the piece of beef had to be left on the bottom until low tide the next day when we were fortunately able to retrieve it with grappling hooks.
2. Had this ration shipment been sent forward via s.s. "Border Prince" it would have arrived at 1030 hours Tuesday morning, and the milk would have been placed in our refrigerator fifteen hours earlier, and the ~~meat~~ would have been landed by ship's tackle directly on the wharf at York Island.







FIRE PROTECTION

1. Indent No. 43, dated 11th June, 1940, for 4500 feet of fire hose has not been approved by Ordnance. This fire hose is urgently required.
2. Last night, July 14th, a small bush fire was reported to be burning in the North-west portion of the Island. The gun crew at the fort attempted to extinguish the fire but due to a strong westerly wind blowing they were unable to cope with it, and the general fire alarm was given. All available men and tools were mobilized to extinguish this blaze which was gaining momentum every minute. However, it was finally put under control when sea water was pumped on it. In this connection I have the following observations to make:
  - i) At present our available hose consists of 14 - 100 ft. lengths which was barely sufficient to reach from the shore to the scene of the fire.
  - ii) As this hose is maintained for use at the stand pipes in the camp area, considerable delay ensued in gathering this together.
  - iii) Although this hose appears to be of fairly good quality several splits and leaks developed due to the high pressure produced — 175 to 200 lbs. per sq. in. -- in order to lift the water to a height of about 160 ft. It is therefore suggested that authority be obtained to issue two or three lengths of rubber hose for each of our three pumps. This stronger hose will be used where the pressure is the greatest, just above the pump.
  - iv) With regard to the fittings, the quick action couplings provided were attached to the hose by means of the usual type of clamp which is held together with a nut and bolt. This system is not satisfactory. It is pointed out the Forestry Branch have a special type of tool which they use to twist double wire very tightly and securely to fasten the couplings at the end of the hose. It is suggested that the R.C.E. Works Officer may be able to provide us with such a tool as several couplings will now have to be reattached.

1. At about 1130 hours, 13th July, a fishing packer crossed the examination line on the north side of the channel, without reporting to the examination vessel, R.N.C.E.B. "MacDonald," which was checking two vessels proceeding east on the south side of the channel.

2. The fishing packer was apparently unable to hear or understand the stop signals given by the L.V. and continued on its course. When it was evident that it would take considerable time for the L.V. to overhaul the vessel the C.O.D. ordered a Bring-To round to be fired across the bow. No. 1 gun fired a round but this signal was ignored and a further round was fired which was also ignored. On the third round the vessel gave way and altered course to report to the L.V., and the L.O. dealt with the case.

3. The boat proved to be the "Ray Roberts" (V001G), master, Walter Sildan, R.R. No. 1, New Westminster, B.C.

"I have just taken over the post of Minister of National Defence Stop My colleague the Minister of National Defence for Air and the Honourable A.L. 1. The m/n man was granted seven days leave of absence from 9th July to 15th July. He was returning to report for duty, York Island, as a passenger on board s.s. "Border Prince" at 2130 hours, July 15th, he shot himself with a .32 calibre revolver.

2. The master of the s.s."Border Prince" called at Powell River to put the body ashore and it was taken charge of by Coroner Bearlet and Opl. Sweeny of the Provincial Police. The master of the ship also notified his agents in Vancouver, Borderline Navigation Co., who, in turn, notified the military authorities in Vancouver.

3. It is believed that Wilson took his life during a fit of despondency as his medical category did not allow him to join the draft for the "Z" Force.

4. The master of the s.s."Border Prince" states that all his clothing and equipment which he was carrying with him were turned over to the Provincial Police at Powell River for disposal.

Will you please arrange to have this forwarded to York Island per S.S. "Border Prince" leaving Vancouver about July 28th.
2. The lifeboat sent up needs painting very badly, and I am having the old paint sealed off, as I presume you wish these lifeboats redelivered back to the Navy at some future date in as good condition as possible.
3. Will you please instruct the D.O.O. to ship:  
10 gals. Aluminum paint for a base  
10 gals. Antifouling paint for the bottom  
20 gals. white paint  
5 gals. Turpentine
4. To stand up to the wear and tear these vessels should have four or five coats. I anticipate this should be enough for the two lifeboats and possibly for the other lifeboat to be sent up as water boat.

WATER STORAGE

1. In the scheme for water distribution it was proposed to build a tank on the top of the Island to supply water to the Fort and provide fire protection.
2. It was proposed to install a wooden water tank.
3. Our experience with the wood stave tank now installed half way up the hill is that unless the tank is filled up completely nearly all the time the staves dry out at the top, when the water is not standing, during hot weather. This causes considerable leakage when the staves are dried out.
4. After discussing the matter with Mr. R. Mann, the Works Foreman, I suggest that the tank be changed to a concrete or steel tank to avoid this trouble.
5. A concrete mixer will be sent up to build the crew shelter and parapet walls and could be used to build a concrete tank.
6. In addition I request that the tank be increased in size to give at least one week's water supply in case this Fort is cut off by enemy attack. Consumption at present is nearly 5,000 gallons per day, whereas the wooden tank now installed holds 15,000 gallons.







MEALS - PERSONNEL RETURNING FROM YORK ISLAND

Reference your letter 24th July, 1940, file 82-2-15.

1. Will you please advise me the specific instances in which personnel demanded a midnight meal on the boat in addition to the usual breakfast, so that I can check on same. Broad general statements are useless; you can give details.
2. For your information no authorization has been given on warrants for personnel to obtain midnight meals at Government expense. If a man wants a midnight meal and is willing to pay for it, he is, of course, within his rights in asking for it.
3. Reference your para. 3 and 4, your instructions are impracticable because the vessels southbound do not pass at regular hours in the morning like passenger trains. They pass at all hours of the day and night, depending on the amount of cargo to be handled en route, time of slack water in Seymour Narrows, etc. We have had cases when vessels have been 14 hours late, and we have no means of finding out the time of arrival at Johnston Straits or Kelsey Bay. If a man travels all day on the vessel he is entitled to all three meals, and that is what we name on his warrant.
4. Leave Personnel. No personnel proceeding on leave have been supplied with meal warrants.
5. Before issuing such broad sweeping instructions I suggest that it is desirable for Staff Captain, Vancouver Area, to ascertain local conditions on York Island so that he knows what he is talking about. I suggest that he be instructed to pay a visit to York Island, and on his return we could arrange for him to sit in a boat in Johnston Straits waiting three or four hours, in the middle of the night, for a C.N. passenger vessel or sit on Kelsey Bay Wharf for six hours waiting for a Union S.S. Co. vessel.

Mechanical Saw - YORK ISLAND

1. In March, 1940, the D.S. & T.O. hired a drag saw for use on York Island (letter D.S.A.T.O., 4th March, File 89F-1-S-1).
2. This saw arrived about May 7th and was adversely reported on by Lieut. A. Webster, R.C.E. (letter York Island, 7th May, File 8-4).
3. D.S.& T.O. advised that arrangements have been completed for purchase by D.P.O. of a saw for York Island, and that the hired one was to be returned (letter 13th May, 1940.)
4. The new drag saw promised has not yet been received consequently the old rented one is still in use, with frequent stoppages for repairs. This old saw now needs numerous new parts in order to keep it running, but the Ordnance Officer, R.C.E. Works Officer, D.D.S.& T.O., Vancouver, all disclaim any authority for supply of spare parts.
5. Will you please advise me:-  
 (a) Is the old saw to be retained up here on hire, and if so, which department supplies spare parts?  
 (b) or, alternatively, when will the D.P.O. send up the new saw, as advised in D.S. & T.O. letter 13th May, 1940?
6. The purchase of a new saw is more satisfactory as continued purchase of new parts means eventually the owner of the old saw receives a practically new saw bought piece by piece. I understand the cost of a heavy duty drag saw would be about \$230.00.
7. The saw is used for clearing up the Island, any logs encountered during clearing operations being sawn up and used for fuel. There is sufficient clearing on the Island to keep the saw going for months, possibly years.


