155-6 DEBTS CONTRACTED BY PERSONNEL
OF THE CANADIAN ARMY.

C A R O No 1997 is repeated for information and guidance;

"The number of accounts, owing by officers and other ranks of the Canadian Army, referred to National Defence Headquarters by merchants and manufacturers has increased considerably during the past few months, and it is pointed out to all ranks that payment of the legitimate debts contracted by members of the Canadian Army should be made or arranged with the least possible delay


With the exception that no execution can be taken against the person, pay, arms, equipment, regimental necessaries or clothing of a soldier as that expression is used in the Army Act, Officers and other ranks of the Canadian Army are subject to legal procedure in the same manner and to the same extent as all other subjects of his majesty. Furthermore, each individual is responsible at all times that sufficient money is kept to his credit in the bank account to pay all cheques issued by him. Failing to do so, he is liable to be prosecuted under Section 405 of the Criminal Code, in addition to any military proceedings to which he may be subject.

Failure by Officers and Other Ranks to pay or arrange payment of their just debts causes adverse criticism to which as a matter of courtesy, all correspondence in connection with private debts requires to be acknowledged and referred to Commanding Officers to be brought to the attention of the debtor, thus causing substantial waste of time and paper on correspondence which should not be necessary.

Officers Commanding are responsible that all legitimate debts of their units are met, and that the attention of all personnel under their command is directed, to the necessity for paying their individual debts, especially, when moving from one station to another".

188-4 LEAVE AND FURLOUGH.

Effective immediately no further leave will be granted to officers or other ranks until further orders. Personnel now on leave need not be recalled. Short passes may be given but these will not allow absence from respective stations

188-5 WEARING OF STEEL HELMETS AND RESPIRATORS ANTI/GAS

Steel helmets and respirators anti-gas will be worn or carried in defensive works.

188-6 SECURITY OF MILITARY INFORMATION

- All ranks are warned against communicating, either verbally or in writing, any item of information respecting Naval, Army or Air Force matters which may be of value to the enemy.
- In particular, private correspondence should make no mention of the following -
 - The disposition, movement or projected movement of warships, merchant ships, troops or aircraft
 - Details as to numbers, armament, equipment or condition of ships of all kinds, troops or aircraft.
 - Any measures which have been taken or which are projected for the defence of any place.

-7 KIT BAGS DEFACING OF.

1. It has come to notice that kit bags are being defaced with various decorations inscribed with ink or indelible pencil and are therefore not suitable for restoration and re-issue.
2. Kit bags should be marked with the regimental number of the soldier and the initials of the regiment or corps only; the numerals and letters will be $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and in black paint, placed on the side of the bag as near the centre as possible. The regimental number of the soldier will also be placed on the bottom of the kit bag as near the centre as possible.
3. Officers Commanding will take the necessary steps to ensure that only the authorized markings are placed on kit bags and to inform all concerned that the placing of various decorations etc on kit bags is forbidden.
4. stencils and paint etc for marking of kit bags will be secured in accordance with the Scale of issue under Routine Order 217

158-9 WEARING OF BELTS WITH BUNNED DRESS WARRANT OFFICERS CLASS II AND KEY N.C.O's AND MEN.

1. Belts waist, leather or web, will only be worn with khaki drill jackets when on parade or duties necessitating the wearing of belts and side arms.
2. The khaki drill belts provided with the open collar pattern khaki drill jackets will be worn on all occasions, except on parades or duties necessitating the wearing of equipment

158-9 ADDRESSING OF MAIL TO TROOPS OVERSEAS.







The use of flashlights in the forts is to be reduced to emergencies only; visiting rounds for instance will not use a flashlight unless some emergency occurs. The use of a flashlight to avoid slipping in mud puddles or stubbing toes on rocks will be discontinued. In the event of an alarm, flashlights must not be used except by the setter for range or layer, but in the case of auto sights, no flashlights will be used whatever. Sentries will not use flashlights for more than a momentary flash for the purpose of identifying people. The practise of pressing the bulb and keeping a beam on the approaching individual will be discontinued.

It must be realized that in England, no flashlights are allowed and that in the event of an attack, the man using the flashlight is only pin-pointing the attention of the attacker on himself or on the fort in general.

21-G PENSIONERS - MILITIA PENSION ACT: (App. to Army Order 253)

Attention is directed to Article 71A, F.R.&I. (Can) regarding the procedure to be followed upon enlistment in Active Units of the Canadian Army of personnel who are in receipt of a pension under the Militia Pension Act. Where the provisions of this Article have not been complied with, re-enlisted pensioners have irregularly drawn pay and allowances with the result that, when the overpayment is discovered, recovery has to be made, thereby causing hardship and financial embarrassment to the individual.

An ex-soldier in receipt of a pension under the Militia Pension Act must be informed of the conditions with which he will have to comply immediately upon his enlistment in any Active Unit of the Canadian Army. Before he is enlisted, he is to be informed that no pay and allowances will be issued to him in respect of his enlistment until the waiver of pension (called for in paragraph (2) of Article 71A F.R.&I. (Can.)) is executed and delivered.

The form of ~~xxx~~ waiver is set forth in Appendix to this order. Supplies of waivers and seals are available from Dist. H.Q.

Immediately upon the enlistment into an Active Unit of the Canadian Army of an individual who is in receipt of a pension under the Militia Pension Act, notification is to be forwarded by the District Officer Commanding concerned to National Defence Headquarters giving pensioner's

- a. Name in full
- b. Former regimental number in Permanent Force.
- c. Rank at time of discharge to pension
- d. Active Unit of the Canadian Army in which enlisted and date of such enlistment.




