

1. This includes communications from serving soldiers addressed direct to the Dependents' Allowance Board.

2. Quite apart from the irregularity of this procedure, delay ensues in dealing with the questions raised in these communications, as, in nearly every case, the matter has to be referred back to the District or Unit concerned to obtain the requisite information.

3. In nearly every case, the subject of the communication could more readily be dealt with locally.

4. Communications received have in no way been confined to complaints, but have included ideas to assist in the conduct of the War.

5. All ranks are therefore to be informed of the correct procedure for bringing to notice of higher authority any matters whether it be complaint or otherwise.

6. It is to be impressed upon officers, warrant officers and non-commissioned officers that it is their duty to give proper attention and careful consideration to all matters brought to their notice by those under their command, and in the case of complaints, that the officers or other rank concerned is duly paraded in accordance with Sections 42 and 43 of the Army Act and notes thereto. (See K.R. (Can) 417-19.)

7. Officers and other ranks are to be informed that direct communication with higher authority except through the immediate superior concerned is forbidden.

8. Attention is directed to Routine Order 1060, as amended by Routine Order 1072 regarding direct communication with the Naval Military or Air Force officials of another country.

88-8 COMMUNICATION OF MILITARY INFORMATION:

1. All ranks are warned against communicating, either verbally or in writing, any item of information respecting Naval, Army, or Air Force matters which may be of value to the enemy.

2. In particular, private conversation and correspondence should make no mention directly or indirectly of the following:-

- (a) The disposition, movement, or projected movement of warships, merchant ships, troops or aircraft.
- (b) Details as to numbers, armament, equipment or condition of ships of all kinds, troops or aircraft.
- (c) Any measures which have been taken or which are projected for the defence of any place.

3. Officers Commanding will make sure that all ranks are aware that they must not disclose to unauthorized persons, in telephone conversations or in telegrams, information which might be useful to the enemy.

4. Any matters which may be of direct or indirect assistance to the enemy are not to be discussed by Officers or Other Ranks other than in the line of duty.

5. (a) Attention is drawn to para 433 (a) D.R. (Can) which provides in part:-

"An officer or soldier is forbidden to publish or communicate, either directly or indirectly, to the press, any military information, or his views on any military subject, without special authority from National Defence Headquarters.

(b) Officers and other ranks are forbidden to communicate to the press their personal views on any matters appertaining to, or connected with, their military duties.

(C.A.R.O. 2091).

88-9 CARE OF BOOTS: (R.O. 1246)

1. Boots will be treated with boot dressing or dubbin during the period November 1 to April 30.

2. The removal of dubbin or boot dressing by the use of gasoline or other similar solvents, by the application of hot irons or by other similar methods, with a view to obtaining a high polish, also removes the original oils used by the tanner and the leather preservatives used by the manufacturer. This shortens the life of the boots and reduces their waterproof qualities. Therefore this practice is forbidden in this unit.
