60-4 IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATE - ACTIVE FORCE - M.F.M. 88.

(a) In order that personnel of the Canadian Army Active Force who were not required to register under the National Resources Mobilization Act may be identified when on leave in civilian clothes or when wearing recreational dress, M.F.M. 88, Identification Certificate, has been printed and will be requisitioned for by Officers Commanding Units through the usual channels.

(b) M.F.M. 88 will be issued by Officers Commanding Units in Canada to all Officers, Nursing Sisters and Soldiers who were serving in the Active Forces prior to August 21st, 1940, and who were not required to register under the National Resources Mobilization Act.

(c) M.F.M. 88 will be carried at all times.

(d) Members of the Active Force, taken on strength subsequent to August 21st, 1940, will retain their National Registration Certificates and will not be issued with M.F.M. 88.

(e) On discharge, the Officer, Nursing Sister or soldier will surrender M.F.M. 88, which will be attached to Discharge Documents by the Officer carrying out the discharge. The individual being discharged will be instructed to register at the nearest Post Office, vide R.O. 657.

Registration of Military Personnel at York Island will begin at a time to be announced in Part I Orders by the Officer Commanding York Island.

BREAD

1. The baker, Pte. Boyer, is in Hospital suffering from a poisoned hand and will not be fit for duty for some time.
2. To make matters worse, 1/Sgt. Patterson, our Cook, fell and has a suspected fractured leg. Under the circumstances we cannot use the flour you sent up yesterday.
3. Until the next rations arrive on Tuesday I am buying as much bread locally as I can obtain and propose to send the bills to you for payment. The local supplies are not very large and it is doubtful if we will have enough but will get by on other rations.
4. I have telegraphed you this morning asking you to substitute bread for flour on the rations leaving Monday, arriving Tuesday.
5. Last night I telegraphed H.Q. MDXI asking them to instruct District Depot to send up another baker in place of Pte. Boyer.

The N.C.O. of the Guard will visit the Post at Courtney Bay at least once every three hours during his tour of duty.

MD XI? VICTORIA B.C.WIRELESS COMMUNICATION - YORK ISLAND

1. The Wireless Station at York Island is open from 0600 Hrs until 2130 Hrs daily, but in practice it does not open usually until 0700 Hrs. After 2130 Hrs. we are not able to communicate with Vancouver or Victoria until the following morning.
2. If an attack took place between 2130 Hrs and 0600 Hrs it would be impossible for us to notify you of the attack.
3. I would respectfully point out that a vessel could slip past York Island during the night, and proceeding at 25 knots could be at Vancouver before we could notify them at the opening of the W/T in the morning.
4. This would eliminate any value this Fort has as an outpost, to notify Vancouver or Victoria of any enemy attack proceeding past York Island during these hours.

Thanks for your letter of 1-Mar-1941 which arrived on the last mail. Our men have all settled down now for another spell on this Island. We have had one or two cases of German measles but has not affected the rest of the men.

Replying to your request as to how many men are fixed for woollen comforts, we could use 100 turtle neck scarves and 55 sweaters. While at Point Grey we received 65 sweaters and some plain scarves but soon after a draft left for overseas and we now have approximately 30 recruits who have nothing in the way of woollen comforts. The strength of this Battery is about 104.

Referring to your request about the movie films, I did not know they were on the Island till last week. These films have now been shown and I am returning them on this mail. Until you wrote I did not know where they came from.

Our Recreation Hall needs a considerable amount of doing up but we had Mr. Hearst of the Y.M.C.A. on the Island last week and he promised that he would do what he could to get the Y.M.C.A. to supply us with some furniture and games. Until I know what he is going to do I am not asking for any more from you for the Canteen.

Thanking you for your interest in our men which is much appreciated by them all.

H.V. GENERAL CALDWELL.

1. Will you please advise me as to the number of passengers which can be carried on this vessel when sailing in the vicinity of York Island. I am informed that it will be necessary to have a Federal Steamship Inspection Certificate as specified in Dominion of Canada Shipping Act, otherwise in case of accident the O.C. York Island would be criminally liable and the skipper of the vessel would have his certificate endorsed and be unable to command a vessel when he returns to civil life.

2. Life Saving Equipment - This vessel is equipped with a dinghy, 10 foot long and about 2 foot 6 inches wide, capacity 3 persons, 6 life belts stowed underdeck. I have supplied him with 3 more life belts but it will be necessary to increase this very materially to comply with the Steamship Inspectors Safety requirements.

3. Passenger Accommodation.- Apart from the crew's quarters, which should not be used for passengers, the only accommodation underdeck is a small after hold, depth varying from 3 foot 6 inches to 1 foot 6 inches, entered by a hatch 3 foot 10 inches by 5 foot 10 inches. I doubt very much whether the Federal Steamship Inspector will allow any man to be put in this after hold.

4. For your information, on various occasions we have had to carry 40 to 50 men across Johnstone Straits to Kelsey Bay. Last Saturday we had to bring 2 Officers and 30 O.R's, with about 5 tons of baggage, stores and rations, from the S.S. Catella at Kelsey Bay.

5. This vessel is comparatively shallow draft, drawing 4 foot aft, 2 foot 6 inches forward, with no hand rails aft of the funnel, and I doubt very much whether it is safe to carry passengers on deck across Johnstone Straits when the usual summer westerly wind is blowing.

6. Regardless of whether it is necessary or not to have a Federal Steamship Inspectors Certificate, I suggest that it would be advisable to have a vessel comply with the safety laws of Canada, as I presume the Department of National Defence does not wish to endanger men's lives by breaking laws.

ESTABLISHMENT.

1. The M.O. has stated that if this Garrison goes into action it would be necessary at least to have 8 men to act as stretcher bearers to carry wounded from any place on the Island to the Hospital because the establishment of the Hospital does not permit them to use any men for this purpose.

2. I request that consideration be given to increasing the strength of this Battery, 1 N.C.O. and 8 men to act as stretcher bearers, and that if approved, application be made to Ottawa for this increase.

3. I would respectfully point out that the present establishment of this Battery is on the same basis as the Batteries in Vancouver or Victoria, where Infantry supply men for defence outside the vicinity of the Fort, whereas on this Island the Infantry have been withdrawn and consequently the present detachment has to supply men for duties which it was considered 1 Officer and 40 O.R's would be necessary to fulfill.

4. Under the circumstances I have told the M.O. that if this Garrison went into action we could not guarantee to supply men for stretcher bearers as all employed men and spare Gunners are needed to act as Infantry in local defence.

5. The M.O. states that the stretcher bearers section should be specially allotted for this purpose and undertake other duties while being trained, and would automatically assume this duty in case of action, as it might be the case of saving many men's lives. I approve of his recommendation but have had to point out the insufficient number of men on the existing establishment.

- These books have to be signed for, and returned to the Canteen as early as possible, they are only here for a limited time and have to be returned to the Canadian Legion, and are only to be used by those taking the courses.

73-6 SECURITY OF MILITARY INFORMATION:

All ranks of the CASF are warned against communicating either ~~xxxxxxxx~~ verbally or in writing, any item of information respecting Naval, Army or Air Force matters which may be of value to the enemy. In particular private correspondence should make no mention of the following:

- The disposition, movement, or projected movement of warships, merchant ships, troops or aircraft.
- Details as to numbers, armament, equipment or condition of ships of all kinds, troops or aircraft.
- Any measures which have been taken or which are projected for the defence of any place.

Accordingly, officers and other ranks are forbidden to:

- Insert advertisements or letters in any publication inviting strangers to communicate with them.
- To enter into correspondence with strangers in response to advertisements or other invitations.
- In any other way to communicate with strangers by letter or otherwise concerning anything of a military nature.



4. Without these skilled men the mechanical equipment on my charge can not be properly looked after which incurs expenses in repairs and overhaul. I am informed that the 4th Fortress E & M Coy have men capable for this work.

FIRE HAZARD

1. This Island is covered with trees and fallen timber. During the months of June, July and August it is very dry and the fire hazard is very considerable. The largest forest fire in British Columbia last year occurred within 10 miles of this camp. This matter was taken up with the D.E.O. in January, 1940, who obtained an allotment for about \$6,000 and sent up civilians to commence the clearing, but owing to delay in starting, the work, this appropriation was not expended as the men had to be sent home owing to the fire hazard.

2. I request that civilian employees be used to use up the unexpended balance of the appropriation, which I am informed is about \$1,200, and that in addition consideration be given to further appropriation to reduce this fire hazard.

3. I respectfully point out that the Department of National Defence has spent several hundred thousand dollars in the fort and camp at York Island, all of which is endangered by forest fires. In addition, in the event of an attack by an enemy during the summer months, this fort could be put out of action by a few incendiary shells or bombs. While it would not be necessary to make the whole Island fire proof, it could be decreased by clearing underbrush etc. at no great cost to the public.

- (3) It has come to notice that Warrant Officers and N.C.O.'s of certain units formerly clothed in cloaks but now issued with greatcoats are continuing to wear their chevrons and badges of rank on their greatcoats in the manner prescribed for cloaks. This is contrary to regulations and in future all such personnel wearing greatcoats will wear their chevrons and badges of rank in the manner indicated in para. 2 above.

1. Reference your letter VS.38-2-5-3, dated March 15th, 1941, instructing that stretcher bearers are to be supplied from the spare Gunners on the Establishment.

2. This raises the question of the strength of the 85th Bty to be maintained on York Island. Enclosed is a list of the men of the 85th Bty who are away for various reasons, mostly Medical. As each Medical case is sent down, the M.O. York Island explains the reasons, and I consider that no unnecessary cases are being sent down. The principal reason is that York Island Station Hospital is only equipped for slight accident and sickness cases, and is consequently not equipped with X Ray and other expensive apparatus which modern medicine considers necessary for diagnosis and treatment.

3. In addition the question of leave is coming up, as most of the men are due for leave now, which will mean we will be short another ten or fifteen men.

4. The attached list shows that we are short over 20% of our total strength. In addition to manning the 4.7 guns, Maxim M.G.'s and Anti-Aircraft LMG's since the Infantry guard of 40 All Ranks has been withdrawn, this Bty is made responsible for the local defence not only of the Fort but of the Island itself.

5. I would respectfully draw your attention that in case of attack this Bty. in all probability would be short of 15 to 20% of its personnel away for various reasons mentioned. This condition is not new as my predecessor Major R.T. DuMoulin experienced the same difficulty in keeping the strength up, due to the isolated situation.

6. In Vancouver the Batteries can be reduced below full strength owing to leave without any danger, as leave men and reinforcements can be called on short notice, but this is impossible at York Island.

7. If it is desired to maintain this Garrison at full strength, it will be necessary to station additional men here, either from the District Depot or elsewhere to take care of this situation as even our full Establishment is insufficient to guard the Island without any Infantry support, or any possibility of reinforcements at short notice.

8. The above is a question of policy which I am not competent to decide, but refer to you for consideration.

Reference your letter 17-Mar-1941 and 19-Mar-1941, file 34F-5-1.

1. Reference para 2 your letter 17-Mar-1941. Fenders: These fenders are to be used for going alongside a ship when putting passengers aboard or taking them off in Johnstone Straits. They are more efficient than truck tires and would probably save their cost in a very short time in saving repairs to the General Caldwell.

2. Reference para 3. Ballast: Sgt. McKenzie has stated that sand would not be advisable as ballast because bags break and sand would get into bilges and then into the pumps and clog them. The main reason for scrap iron is that it is heavy in proportion to volume and takes less room than sand or gravel. The space under the floor is very limited, which accounts for our request for old rails.

3. Reference para 1 your letter 19-Mar-1941. Will you please arrange to send up life-belts so one life-belt will be available for each passenger, also please ask the D.E.O. to authorize use of lumber and carpenters on York Island to make boxes for these life-belts, to be placed on deck so they will be ready and available in case of accident. It is suggested that a life-raft be supplied as the present dinghy only carries three men.

4. Reference para 2. The D.E.O. has not yet commenced construction of a berth for this scow, neither has he made any arrangements for building a loading berth at proposed site for obtaining water. It is suggested that the scow be kept at Esquimalt till this berth is constructed, even though of cost of freight on S.S. Border Prince, and is suggested that the D.E.O. be instructed to expedite this work to save the Government money.

5. Reference para 3. Sampson Posts: The existing pleats on the fore-deck are considered not to be large enough, or strong enough to stand the drag of the scow. This is concurred in by the Naval Officers on York Island.

6. Reference para 4. It is immaterial to us whether Sgt. McKenzie and his crew sleep ashore or afloat. The suggestion was made to sleep ashore and considered they would be more comfortable than in their confined berths afloat. At present however, they are all sleeping afloat.

7. Reference para 5. The boom and mast of this vessel are not long enough to lift drums of Diesel Oil, weighing 450 pounds, from the after-deck onto the wharf. Sgt. McKenzie tried out the line on the boom and it broke, with a comparatively small load, much less than 1,000 pounds. It is pointed out that the rise and fall of tide at York Island is at times 17 feet, and the present mast and boom are very unsatisfactory. I am investigating the question of a double and single block, but he suggested what is really needed is a longer mast with brace down to the keel, with stronger boom, also a nigger head winch driven off the main engine, be supplied, similar to those used on fish boats. This will however involve work by a shipyard and would take some time.

7. Reference para 7. Apparently there was a little difficulty regarding meals at a regular hour for the crew of this vessel. I have given orders that they have to have meals whenever they come in no matter how irregular, and think that will be satisfactory. If he wishes, I am quite agreeable to him going on subsistence, but would point out that Staff Sgt. Stenger has stated several times that they have difficulty in making both ends meet on the Kitchener as allowance is very small.

1. Please refer to my letter of Sept. 1940, file 7-2, written soon after this Truck arrived at York Island, in which I stated that this Truck was unsuitable for use on the muddy and hilly roads at York Island, and will be a continuous source of expense.

2. This prophecy has been amply fulfilled, as evidenced by the numerous letters written by my relief Major K.T. Duboulin asking for spare parts.

3. I wrote on March 7th of this year asking that an Ordnance Officer be sent up to look over this truck and have it condemned as it needs new cylinders and also new parts, and I do not consider it worth while that the Dept. spend more money on a truck which is over nine years old and I am informed that it has been written off once already by your Dept.

4. I request that the Dept. supply us with a one ton truck, four speed transmission, and dual balloon tires suitable for working over rough roads and hilly country. Speed is not essential, in fact the truck should be geared to travel at low speeds as most of the time it would be travelling uphill over very rough and muddy roads. A truck of this kind is necessary to move stores from the wharf to the camp and Fort and also to the Searchlight Implantations at different parts of the Island. At present we have to use the Tractor belonging to the R.C.E. for this purpose. This tractor was supplied for clearing land and is not very suitable hauling stores as it tears up the all the roads, but as it is the only means we have, we have to use it.

5. I request that this letter be given prompt and carefull consideration, and permission be obtained from R.D.M.Q. for issue of a suitable truck.
