126-4 COMPULSORY VACCINATION, INCOULATION, BLOOD EXAMINATION OR REAL AND ADDRESS AND INFOCTIOUS DISEASE

1. Routine Order No. 1327 is cancelled.

2. The provisions of General Order No. 136 of 1942 is published hereunder for information:

in by vitue of the War Measures Act, Chapter 206, R.S.C., 1927, and notwithstanding the provisions of any Statute, Order or Regulation resoins the provisions of Order in Council P.C. 6375, dated 19th August, 1941, and orders as follows:

1. An officer or soldier of the Canadian Army serving in Canada or electror shall, when ordered by his superior officer, acting on the advise of the appropriate Army Nedical Authorities, submit to vaccination, inoculation or treatment against ank infectious disease and to blood examination, as the case may be.

2. The unreasonable refusal by any officer or soldier of the Canadian army serving on active service to submit to vaccinction, inoculation, treatment or blood examination, as the case may be, when ordered to do so as aforesaid, shall be deemed to be disobedience of a lawful command given by his superior officer and to constitute an offence against subsection two of section nine of the APRY Act and the said subsection shall, as part of the law of Canada, be construed accordingly.

S. It shall be a defence to any presecution of an offence under this Order to prove that such vaccination incoulation, treatment or blood examination is contrary to the dectrines of the religion of such officer or soldier, or that a qualified physician has contrict that such vaccination, inoculation, treatment or blood examination would likely be injurious to the health of any such officer or soldier.

126-5 SENERY INDIVIDUAL SOLDIER CARRYING HIS RIFLE WHEN AWAY PROM

FIS QUARTERS

1. A Soldier will carry his rifle at the slung position and salute an officer by turning his head and eyes to the right or left as the case may be.

2. SENTRY ON OPERATIONAL QUARD DUTY

A soldier acting as sentry on operational guar duty who is standing at ease on his post will come to attention when his post is visited or passed by an officer of any rank or by an aread or unarmed party. No distinction will be made for general or field officers or aread or unarmed parties as laid down in King's Regulations and Orders for the Canadian Militia 1939, paragraphs 1408, 1407 and 1408.

- A sentry who normally marches on his beat with his rifle slung will pay compliments by halting and facing his front, maintaining his rifle at the slung position.
- 5. Operational guard duty will include all guards including quarter guards and sentries with the exception of those mounted on special cerewonial manage occasions.
