Tork Island	29		<p>Officers reconnoitered the Island and surveyed available accommodation which consisted of the Caretakers Quarters, a 5 room bungalow; a bunkhouse, 18 by 50; a mess hut 22 by 45; a small hut, 16 by 16; also a radio station hut, 10 by 14. The caretakers house was found to be occupied by two District Gunners of 5th Hvy. Bty and a signalman of No. 11 Det. ROCS. A Cold lunch was prepared as no stove pipe was sent with the camp stove. The launch "York" was sent to Kelsey Bay for various supplies, including stove pipe and kerosine for the lanterns. The men worked hard in pouring rain sorting out stores and carrying them away from the <del>next</del> wharf. The tractor delivered was useless, as it refused to start. 34 men were quartered in the bunk house, 9 N.C.O.s in the small hut. 4 N.C.O.s in the empty w/t station at the Fort, 2 O.R.s in the launch "York", 4 O.R.s in the Mess Hut, 4 O.R.s in the basement of the caretakers quarters, 2 O.R.s in the Radio Station, and the 4 Officers in the Caretakers Quarters.</p>	
	30		<p>Spent day cutting wood, moving stores and ammunition. A "Cat Driver" from the Salmon River Logging Co., was engaged to start and operate the tractor. More ammunition was sent up by the tractor in the afternoon. Weather : Raining</p>

In respect to the manning of York Island during hostilities when a detachment of approximately twenty-six men are required, the following suggestions are put forward. These suggestions have been the result of considerable thought on my part during the week which the battery has occupied the Island.

1. WATER SUPPLY.

The present water supply is inadequate. A tank of 5000 gallons, dependent on rain is all the water available. This water is available to the officers quarters only, but a hose has been connected from the house to the mens kitchen which helps considerably. The gas boat "York" has tanks of 208 gals. capacity and these are filled by hand from a creek on Hardwick Island. This requires considerable men and time. The only way that the water can be conveyed from the launch to the house is by a small hand pump and hose. It is apparent that if a period of dry weather prevails, the Island would be untenable for any length of time, since each man requires a minimum of 5 gals per day and for permanent residence in barracks 20 gals. There is no water at the Gun Position.

SUGGESTIONS.

The first consideration is to have a  $\frac{3}{4}$ " pipe line from the officers quarters to the mess house and ablation tables. I realize that this will not help the water supply and will probably increase consumption, but will add to the sanitary condition of the camp, and the comfort of the men.

For a permanent camp on the Island, my only suggestion is a rain catch basin constructed on the South end of the island with a large reservoir at the base from which water may be drawn. It is impossible to estimate the cost of a properly constructed

SUGGESTIONS. (con't)

basin nor have I made any survey., except a superficial reconnaissance from the boat.

I do not know whether drilling for a spring was attempted during construction but it is unlikely that this would be successful.

2. POWER.

At the present time the only electric power is a small 500 watt O.N.A.G. motor generator. This is used for the transmitter and receiver and for lighting the officers quarters. During transmission, the lights must be turned out. During the last four days when the radio has been on duty 24 hrs. the motor generator has run continuously. Since the unit is meant for light duty only there is the increasing danger of a break down.

SUGGESTIONS.

Until the power house on the island is equipped, I suggest that another unit similar and if possible, larger, be kept in reserve.

3. ACCOMMODATION.

At the present time there is one hut approx. 28X50 being used to house about 40 men. The other hut is used for a mess house in which a certain number of men sleep. The remainder of the detachment including five civilian engineers are scattered over the remainder of the huts including the radio shack at the gun position and the basement of the officers quarters. A 20X40 hut is under construction near the mess house and a gun shelter 20X20 will be erected at the gun position. These will re

lieve the situation considerably but if the detachment is increased more accommodation will be necessary. In connection with this, the Salmon River Logging Co. have two floating huts which will house about thirty men each. These I understand can be purchased quite cheaply and might be used. They lack windows and other fittings. They could be tied to the inside of the wharf.

4. GUN POSITION.

No comment is necessary here except that no ammunition recesses have been provided.

5. ALTERNATIVE SUGGESTION.

Since the Island is small, heavily timbered and rocky, there are absolutely no recreational facilities available. As examination service is tedious and the detachments are often idle some form of exercise in the way of competitive sport is necessary.

Taking this fact and the water situation into consideration the following, in my opinion is the best solution:

1. Establish a proper military camp at Sayward. There is ample fresh water and other facilities there and more opportunities for recreation. Since this area I understand calls for two examination vessels- one to patrol Sunderland Channel and the other Johnston Straits, one vessel could be relieved of her duties for an hour a day to transport the detachment on duty to York Island and relieve the manning detachment. Each detachment would be on duty twenty four hours. The other two detachments would be at the base camp at Sayward. Officer personnel might have to be augmented by one or two subalterns. Signal personnel would have to be increased as well but as far as I can see with my limited knowledge of coast defence very few other changes will be necessary.

REPORT ON TRACTOR R.C.E.T. 9.  
AT YORK ISLAND.

The marginally noted tractor was unloaded from E.S. Border Prince on Tuesday August 29. The tractor is a McCormack Deering, model T.D. 40 using Diesel oil. It is started on gasoline with electric ignition and switched to Diesel when started.

Since no operator was provided, a man from the battery who claimed to have experience was detailed to get it started. All attempts failed, so the next morning a logger was sent for from the Salmon River Logging Co. In the meantime, Sgt. Maj. Hatfield of the R.C.C.S. (P.F.) , by cleaning the fuel line got it started on gasoline. When the logger, W. Armstrong, arrived, by making adjustments he got it running on Diesel oil. He reported on a superficial examination that it was badly in need of overhauling since it emitted dark clouds of smoke from the exhaust and had comparatively little power.

As the ammunition and gun stores were lying on the dock covered with a tent, I considered it essential that these be hauled to the gun position as soon as possible. Armstrong therefore, operated the tractor Wednesday afternoon Aug 20, and the morning of Aug 21, until the necessary stores were at the position.

As the tractor was ordered back on the S.S. Border Prince on Saturday, Sept. 2, I ordered Cpl. Manuel, 11th Div. Signs, to operate the tractor and haul up the rolls of wire fencing that were lying on the dock. This was completed but I had word that cement, sand, and gravel were due to arrive on Sunday, Sept 3, for the wire fence. I therefore held the tractor.

It stopped on the dock and refused to start. The cylinders had seized up. I asked W. Armstrong to come over and find out what the trouble was. He took the head and base off and reported that the nozzles had at some time been badly burned and metal had actually fallen onto the pistons. The fuel was not being consumed properly and actually washing the lubricating oil off the cylinder walls so that the pistons eventually seized up. I have ordered four new nozzles, one head gasket and one base gasket from the International Harvester Co., Vancouver and advised you by wire. Armstrong reports that it will be in first class working order when he is finished. I consider that this tractor was in exceedingly poor shape when it arrived.

Progress Report # Radio Station York Island.

Q. C.S.M.Hadfield and two other ranks of the 9th Frt.Signals, Cpl.E.Manuel and Sigmn.T.E.Turner, arrived at York Island via H.M.C.S.Comox on 29th August. Sigmn.Turner being a good operator was detailed to the Radio Station for duty where he has been maintaining watch with Sigmn.Ainsley. Cpl. Manuel is not a good operator and has been assisting in the construction of telephone lines on the island and will be available for maintenance work. He will require considerable practice before being able to take over a watch at the Radio Station. A third operator will probably be required for this station as the two operators are at present doing shifts of 6 hours on duty and 6 hours off duty. They state that they are able to carry on these shifts with no difficulty.

2. Sigmn.Ainsley, who was drawing Subsistence allowance, has been attached to the 89th Bty.R.C.A. for rations since the caretakers quarters were taken over for the Orderly Room and Officer's Quarters. C.S.M. Hadfield is also attached for rations. Since the R.C.A. and the R.C.O.C. are being paid Subsistence allowance may I be advised if the attachment of C.S.M.Hadfield and Sigmn.Ainsley is correct or if they should draw the Subsistence allowance and repay the Battery mess for rations. This is the procedure the R.C.O.C. expect to follow.

3. Telephones and Lines - Lines were laid and three necessary telephones connecting B.O.P., Radio Station and Orderly Room were installed on 31st August. Lines were completed to the Power House and three E.L.EJ's on 5th September and cut in on the B.O.P - Orderly Room party line as required. All lines were laid using the main road and tractor trails so that a minimum amount of clearing was necessary. Approximately 5000 ft. of twisted wire, nine Forestry type insulators and 25 Porcelain knobs remain.


4. Signal Station (BOP) - The Battery Signallers are operating the Signal Station from the B.O.P. to H.M.C.S.Comox using Aldis Lamp by day and Lucas Lamp by night. The Signallers have constructed a 32 ft. mast with a 10 ft.yard. This was rigged with halyards and two blocks, one from the Comox and one from the Radio Station, and erected against the back wall of the BOP being guyed with D.3 cable. This mast can only be

temporary arrangement and if to be used for any length of time should be replaced by a properly guyed and rigged mast which will withstand the high winds at the BOP. The Battery Signallers are able to communicate with the Comox by raising their pennant half-mast after which the Lamp is used. The Comox procedure is similar. If required International code signal flags are available.

5. Radio Station - The transmitter has been re-tuned and relays adjusted so that MCW and Phone are now available. The transmitter unit has been examined and although the circuits appear correct it does not function normally. The Crystal stage for "B" frequency can be brought into oscillation but when the output is applied to the P.A. stage the oscillations will in most cases stop and the circuit will require re-tuning. Attempts to resonate the P.A. tank or vary the Aerial coupling or vary the Ae. Loading Coil produces similar effects so that to put the transmitter on the air necessitates retuning the Crystal stage for a change in each succeeding stage. The Crystal stage then has to be slightly detuned to produce a clear note. The addition of the second Crystal for "A" frequency necessitates retuning the whole circuit for "B" frequency so that it hasn't been possible to pre-tune both frequencies for quick change-over. The transmitter can be kept operating satisfactorily on 5460 Kcs. for the present but it is strongly recommended that it be shipped out for a complete examination to correct the faults. The Marconi Co. branch in Vancouver could possibly do this work with an elapsed time from this station of one week. An A.T.E. transmitter could possibly be supplied to provide the necessary communication to Victoria.

The "Oman" motor generator set has had very long running hours during the past two weeks with the running time varying from 12 to 24 hours daily. Four six volt batteries from the Comox have been charged which accounts for some of the running time. These batteries are used for the Aldis Lamps and one set is used by the Comox and the other by the Battery Signallers. The batteries for the York Island lamp were shipped dry. The Motor Generator is running very well at present but will shortly require an overhaul. It is thought that if the transmitter could be shipped for a check-over the motor could be overhauled during the period it is away and put together in sufficient time to keep the necessary batteries charged.

The following report is submitted on the state of defence of York Island.

## 1. EQUIPMENT.

Report on equipment and ammunition by Sgt. W. Pittendreigh, I.C. R.C.A.

It is not possible to fire No. 1 gun electrically through lack of a socket for the pistol grip connection.

Only 4' rise and fall of tide inscribed on tidal area. No more movement possible at present as cam adjusting lever is cut for a battery having a lower height.

Spare firing pins sent with equipment are of wrong pattern and cannot be fitted into strikers.

2 spare striker needles are not threaded to take connections of electric firing circuit. No recesses have been provided for ammunition which must be kept on gun floors.

Hooks supporting cable are of wrong pattern and cannot be used on breeches.

The above discrepancies have been reported to Ordnance by S. M. Cockburn R.C.O.C.

3. TRAINING.

Training has been carried out daily on gun drill.

4. ACCOMODATION.

Accommodation is still a problem. The distribution is roughly as follows:-

34 men in 18 X 50 construction hut.
2 " " cook house.
9 " " small construction office.
2 " " quartermasters stores.
6 " " basement of officers quarters. (civilian engineers and batman).
2 " " bell tent.
2 " " signallers in radio shack.

Although the new hut 20 X 40 is completed, I have hesitated to insist that the men occupy it, since there is no stove for it and it is cold, damp, and draughty. I have written for stoves as there was only one heating stove sent. In regard to this matter I would suggest that 3 drama stoves be sent to be used in the present new hut, the gun shelter under construction from salvage at the gun position, and the proposed hut. These can be purchased quite cheaply and as there is considerable wood on the island they will suffice for the time being. For the smaller huts, I recommend a small sheet iron wood stove which can also be purchased cheaply. I suggest also that sufficient tar paper and lath be sent to sheath the new and proposed huts. I would also recommend that sufficient lumber be sent to construct one 16 X 20 hospital hut, as well as the 20 X 40 hut proposed.

5. WATER.

The water problem is still acute. When the dead cat was found floating on the surface of the tank was ordered drained. This took considerable time as there is only a half inch hose available on the island. When the tank was emptied as much as was possible it was found that there were several decomposed mice on the bottom, also leaves and other accumulated matter. The M. O. has stated that he does not approve of the system. Since a suggestion that a base camp in Sayward be established, has not been approved, several other suggestions have been advanced. These are as follows:

- A. That a tank scow of about 5000 gals capacity be sent up. This could be anchored off one of the streams on Harwick Island and by means

of a piping system and hose connections, filled with fresh water. This scow could then be towed back to the dock and by means of a power pump, pumped into the large tank, or better still and elevated wooden tank. If this is considered I would suggest that a proper piping system with small dam be constructed on Hardwick. The disadvantage of the above is that the water sea is often quite rough near the stream on Hardwick and difficulty might be experienced in anchoring the scow and leaving it until it filled up.

- B. Have a steamer on regular schedule call and fill the large tank by pump. The advantages of this system is that a regular source of supply of water could be obtained with minimum difficulty. The disadvantages lie in the fact that very few coastal freighters have regular schedules. I do not know whether the Union Steamers would do this.

The whole question of water supply is one which should be given a great deal of thought. I am not qualified to pass on the merits or disadvantages of the various systems I have proposed. Certainly some system such as an elevated tank to which water could be pumped, and distributed by gravity to the cook house and ablution tables, commands itself to me, rather than the continuous hand pumping to the pressure tank as is now necessary.

**6. CLOTHING.**

The men, on arrival at York Island were issued with one service shirt and one pair of trousers. Although I have insisted that these be washed once a week it is desirable that a spare shirt and pair of trousers be available. This is also true regarding underwear and other necessities. Rubber boots have been indented for and a certificate from the M.O. that these are necessary is being submitted.

**7. HEALTH.**

The health of the detachment has on the whole been good except for about ten rather severe colds. These were of sufficient severity to cause the men to be excused duty, in some cases two to three days. I put this down to the dampness and the very crowded quarters. Stoves and sheeting paper on the new huts would eliminate this to a large extent.

**8. RECREATION.**

As mentioned in a previous report, there are no facilities for recreation on the island. The suggestion that men be allowed to go to the mainland on the "York" was rejected as a means of providing a change. It should be realized that the "York" is comparatively small and there are days even at this time when it is too rough for her to

cross the channel. Moreover if small groups of men are sent over, proper recreation can not be organised, and the men may have a tendency to hang around the stores, logging camp, etc. As a suggestion for consideration when the battery is at full strength, it is proposed to allow a few men at a time to go down on the examination vessel when it coals, and either return on her or on the regular passenger vessel. In regard to this I feel it only just that if possible a cheap fare be arranged with the Union Steamship Co.

9. GENERAL.

In regard to the effectiveness of the battery at night, unless the night is clear with moonlight, a ship with no lights can not be seen. Several nights have been hazy with light fog and it has been impossible to see the examination ship or to communicate with her by lamp. This is a distinct disadvantage. During an engagement at night, no observations could be seen unless the target was illuminated.

SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT

WATER SUPPLY

Since writing the preceding report, the S.S.Berwin has pumped into our tank 3000 gals of water. This is a satisfactory arrangement.

I would suggest as an alternative to the pressure system now installed that a rectangular wooden tank (or steel if equipped with manhole) of about 2000 to 3000 gals capacity, or even less, be shipped to the Island. The tractor could haul this to a position above the officers quarters. Piping could then be installed to the mess house, ablation tables and officers house. *and a gravity feed water tank.* At the present tank in the basement a gasoline pump, (a forestry pump could probably be borrowed temporarily) could be installed to pump water from the basement tank to the elevated tank.

By this means water could be obtained from rain or ships. It would also allow for the cleaning of both tanks without the necessity of wasting all the water, by insuring that there were sufficient quantity in either of the tanks.

I would appreciate receiving a plan of any proposed changes, before they are made so that I could ~~not~~ necessary, make suggestions.

3. The reasons for this recommendation are as follows:-
  1. Present building is temporary and crude, having been erected by the contractors for the temporary use of their men.
  2. The kitchen is poorly laid out.
  3. The mess hall needs enlarging.
  4. The floor is unsanitary consisting of a single layer of shiplap which has now shrunk leaving large cracks to accumulate dirt.
  5. The yard at the kitchen door is practically a quagmire in rainy weather.
4. Should this recommendation be adopted it is suggested that the new kitchen be equipped with proper flooring either of wood or linolium and that a proper sink or wash tub be installed.



1. We have for acknowledgement your file No. Y 28-2-5-1. Further to Major F.W. Guiseley's report dealing with recreation, I understand the meaning he intended to convey was that, in view of the fact that personnel engaged in coast defence and anti-sabotage duties in the lower mainland and southern Vancouver Island Areas are permitted 24 hours per week leave of absence providing that 90% of the necessary personnel are continuously on duty, efforts should be made to allow up to 10% of the personnel at York Island to proceed to Vancouver on leave at the cheapest possible transportation cost allowing one weeks leave for every period of six weeks or more service.
2. For your information, it has been necessary for all personnel to carry out fortress duties here continuously seven days a week. However, when the strength of this battery is brought up to war establishment, it will be possible to grant a week leave to seven or eight men at a time without degrading training and fortress duties. While the H.M.C.S. Comox and H.M.C.S. Armentiere were performing the duties of examination vessels, they had to coal at Nanaimo every fourteen days or so but now that examination service has been taken over by vessels of the Fisherman's Reserve, refueling will be done at Alert Bay. However



2. With reference to your letter dated 21st Sept. re documentation C.A.S.F., it is considered highly desirable to retain Bdr. Jameson on the strength of the C.A.S.F. Battery. This man is Category "E" due to defective vision, but this fact does not prevent him from carrying out extremely well his duties as a signaller or R.C.O. i/c of signallers. At the present time, he is considered very valuable for the purpose of training signallers. While at York Island, Bdr. Jameson has been acting as steward of the officers quarters. He is performing these duties very well indeed and Capt. D.A. Dunbar, R.C.A.M.C., President of the Medical Board will also endorse this recommendation to retain Bdr. Jameson.
3. With reference to the return to civil life or non-effective strength of the other three men, we are awaiting your instructions.

MEDICAL BOARD.

1. The Medical Board arrived at York Island at 1600 hours Saturday, 23 Sept. and immediately commenced examining all personnel, and completed examination at 2100 hours.
2. Forms MFM 1 and MFM 2 were completed on page 1 and page 3 on one copy only, as Capt. Dunbar advised that the duplicate and triplicate copies just required the signatures and would be completed in Vancouver. Due to the fact that there is an insufficient supply of MFM 5 only one copy was filled in in most cases. If our Headquarters will fill in the details on the duplicate copies necessary we will have them signed here and sent back. MFM 16 and 16A have been completed on one copy only. If these forms should be required to be completed in more than one copy, please fill them in and we will sign and return these also.
3. For your information, complete documentation here was a very hurried affair, especially in view of the fact that I was unable to get an opportunity to read all your various instructions and other relative letters and orders, or look over the forms until about midnight Saturday, and as the Board left York Island right after lunch on Sunday with all the papers. I trust that you will check everything carefully as there was no opportunity to do so here.

Tractor R.C.E.F. No. 9.

1. Enclosed are invoices in quadruplicate rendered by the Salmon River Logging Co. Ltd., and the International Harvester Co. Ltd., for the driving and repairing of the marginally noted tractor.
2. At present the tractor is unservicable because the cylinder head is cracked in three places. I reported this by wire on 19th Sept. but as yet have not been able to get the diesel engineer of the H.M.C.F. Vanisle to look this machine over to give me his report. However, although I am not qualified to speak authoritatively, I feel sure that the damage to the cracked cylinder head had occurred prior to its arrival at York Island. When head was removed to disclose the condition of the nozzles, the cracks in the head were not evident until the carbon deposits were removed and the valve seats ground.
3. Foreman Waybrow states that he has enough gravel at the Fort to complete the fencing and it is felt that the tractor can be dispensed with. To put the tractor in a servicable condition, the following work is recommended, re bore the cylinders, install oversized piston rings to fit and install new cylinder head.
4. As it is not anticipated that heavy loads, other than ammunition are required to be transported from the wharf to the fort, a light truck would be satisfactory. Alternatively, a low deck hand cart, equipped with drag ropes, might be considered.

Report on York Island #3.

1. Equipment.

(A) Artillery. Both guns are now equipped for firing electrically and by percussion.

Spare needles and firing pins are now available.

Telescopes available are one No. 1 and one No. 3. Another one of each should be provided.

(B) Medium Machine Guns.

Two Vickers Machine Guns are in service for the local defence of the Island. These will be sited as per sketch map attached.

2. Ammunition.

No change, except that the detachment of machine gunners brought an additional 5400 rounds S.A. Ball .303" cartridges.

3. Training.

Gun drill and laying is carried on daily. Loading practice is not considered advisable without a dummy loader.

M.G. Personnel do M.G. drill. Physical training is carried out daily each morning after reveille.

4. Accommodation.

This is now much improved on completion of the second new hut. Available accommodation will be as follows:-

It is understood that water will be shipped in bulk, and all arrangements are being completed to that end. It is proposed to use sea water for showers.

6. Clothing and Necessaries.


No change, except that private sources have donated a shirt and two pair of socks to each man, also a few waterproofs and rubbers. Thus in contrast to the detachment of "C" Coy. 2nd. Bn. (M.G.) C.S.R., who arrived with complete issues of boots, underwear, housewives, shaving kits, etc.


7. Health.

This is very good on the whole.

8. General.

Lieut Cunningham, R.C.E., has visited this station to survey the various engineer problems and proposed buildings include new kitchen, mess hall, hospital hut, and ablution hut. This will give the present strength proper accommodation. However, when it is decided to bring the strength of the battery up to its establishment, two more huts 20x40' will be required. In addition, when searchlight personnel are added, another hut will be required. This should be the total building required.




Report No. 3 York Island.


