

COMMUNICATION OF MILITARY INFORMATION.

310-4

It had been brought to attention that offers or requests to correspond with soldiers are frequently made through the press or otherwise. While many of these offers and requests may be bona fide, it is pointed out that such correspondence might provide a means for obtaining military information of value to the enemy, or of instituting enemy propaganda. Accordingly, Officers, and Other Hanks are forbidden:-

- (a) To insert advertisements or letters in any publication inviting strangers to communicate with them;
- (b) to enter into correspondence with strangers in response to advertisements or other invitations;
- (c) In any other way to communicate with strangers by letter or otherwise concerning anything of a military nature. (C.A.R.O. 2081)


314-5 SALUTING.

315-4 DEPENDENTS ALLOWANCE.

1. Awards of Dependents Allowance made on behalf of Officers and soldiers at the time of appointment or enlistment or subsequent thereto, are based on the state of dependency existing between the Officer or soldier and his dependents at the time applications for Dependents Allowances are submitted. These awards, however are subject to review and possible revision suspension or cancellation in the event that a change in relationship occurs between the Officer or soldier and the dependents concerned.

2. In consequence, changes in relationship that affect awards of Dependents Allowance should be reported immediately such changes take place, in order to avoid overpayments in these allowances which, if incurred, are recoverable from the officer or soldier concerned.

3. The most flagrant cases involving overpayments of Dependents Allowance that have come to attention ~~the~~ through nonreporting of changes of relationship, have arisen in respect of changes in domestic status such as Separation, Divorce, Etc. as such cases are governed by the provisions of Article 101, provisions (iii) and (iv) F.R.&I. (Canada) necessitating in practically every instance, a revision in the current award of Dependents Allowance.

315-4 (cont)

4. Prompt notification of death of dependents or other occurrences affecting dependency is also required, in order to avoid overpayments of dependents allowance
5. All concerned will be impressed with the absolute Necessity for the reporting of changes in relationship between themselves and their dependents immediately such changes occur. This information will be made available to the unit paymaster as soon as received.





328-4 RELEASING OF KEY PERSONNEL FROM EXISTING UNITS ETC.

In view of the serious fuel situation all reasonable effort consistent with imperative Military requirements will be put forth to make adjustment so as to enable application of qualified miners to be granted.

Following conditions will govern men applying for leave for above purposes. No pay or dependants allowance will be paid for the period of leave. All such personal must be Medically boarded including X-Ray prior to proceeding on leave. The provisions of the pension act will not apply respectively injuries or death while on leave for above purposes. All Army equipment save and except necessary wearing apparell will be returned to stores, before going on leave. Personal will be permitted to wear army clothing to their destination but whereas while on leave will not be permitted to wear Military clothing. Free transportation whereas to be furnished personnel from present station to place of employment and return. Personnel granted leave under above must within 14 days of being granted leave furnish to this Headquarters a certificate signed by their employer stating that they are employed as coal miners and thereafter
