#### REPORT ON FIRE - POWER HOUSE YORK ISLAND.

 At 11:20 hours, Sunday 15th Feb. 42, a fire alarm was turned in to the Camp Guard House, and the fire sires sounded the Fire Llaws. The fire played and proceeded to the Fover House, where it along space of three or four minutes, the whole building was found to be in flames.

Pyrame Fire Extinguishers in the power house were too small to cope with the blaze, and when the party arrived with 25 gallon Guardene Extinguishers it was impossible to get close enough to the building to use them, until the water hoses had controlled the fire somewhat.

 In fifteen to eighteen minutes the fire was virtually out, only some embers to be extinguished. All ranks turned to with a will, and did an excellent job.

4. It was during the overhaul of the engine that the accident happend. The engine had been completely taken down, in order that crank shaft bearings might be installed. Certain units have expressed the desire for officers to to be permitted to wear metal unit shoulder titles on services dress and khaki drill in accordance with pre war regimental custom, but itis has been found that there is not sufficient space on the shoulder strap to accommodate three metal rank badges, the brass shoulder title, and the brass "Canada" badge authorized by routine Order 1415.

In order to overcome this either of the following types of badges may be worn by officers in place of the brass "Canada" badge, provide that uniformity is observed in regiments or corps.

With service dress -

(a) Badges, arm, embroidered "Canada" in worsted embroidery of the same pattern as worn by other ranks on the battle dress blouse, 12 inches below the shoulder seam.

OR (b) Badges, arm, "Canada" in 3/8 inch gold embroidered letter on a drab background. Work le inches below the shoulder seam.

With khaki drill -

Badge as in (a) above.
The "Canada" badge authorized for wear by officers and other range with battle dress and greatcoats, is the drab, worsted embroidered "Canada" bagge as issued to other ranks by Ordnance
